Dr. Wyatt stated that he encouraged the Board to approve the resolution, but deferred to Dr. Eugene McKay for further comment. Dr. McKay said that over the past year, committees and senior staff worked together with Foothills Technical Institute on the merger and an agreement has been reached. This resolution must be approved so that Mr. Don Harlan can take it to the Workforce Education Board on December 5, 2002.

BACKGROUND:

Foothills Technical Institute Board of Directors voted on November 5, 2002, to merge with ASU-Beebe. This merger will enable the two campuses of ASU-Beebe to better serve the needs of business/industry in its service area. The two campuses will become one institution with two locations. The Searcy campus will be called ASU-Searcy and will continue to focus on high quality vocational/technical programs and such pre-college programs as the GED and the Area Technical Center Education programs. ASU-Searcy will continue to teach its current curriculum and any additional programs assigned to it; and it may teach these programs at any ASU-Beebe campus or center.

All property, assets, liabilities, diplomas, certificates, and programs will be transferred to Arkansas State University to be governed by the Arkansas State University Board of Trustees.
